SPRINKLER SYSTEMS: Backflow preventers are required on all sprinkler systems. If you didn't have a test on your sprinkler system backflow preventer done last year, please have one done this year and return your report to City Hall or email it to ajacobson@sugarcityidaho.gov. Even numbered addresses are to be tested this year. If you have an odd numbered address and did not test last year, it needs to be tested this year also. Businesses are required to test every year. The deadline to have these completed is **July 1**st to avoid water services from being terminated. If test is not scheduled or completed by then, the city will hire a contractor to do it and charge the homeowner. If you have an appointment to have your test done and it is after the 1st of July, please notify the city at <u>aiacobson@sugarcityidaho.gov</u> with the date it is scheduled and with whom. SUGAR CITY-SALEM-MOODY CEMETERY DISTRICT LEVY: The cemetery needs your help! Over the past 40 years there has not been an increase in the county tax base for the cemetery. The cemetery has been operating on a budget that does not allow important improvements and is barely covering basic maintenance. The levy amount being requested is \$95,000. What does that do to your property tax? It will increase your contribution to the cemetery \$16.58 per \$100,000 assessed property valuation. What will this levy be spent on?

- Replacing existing broken fencing and signs.
- Removing dead trees and landscape improvements.
- Paving the roads and fixing potholes.

- Reclaiming land that could be used for plots.
- Purchasing additional land, they are running out of plots.
