SCHOOL STARTS AUG 20th

MAYOR'S PARK UPGRADED PARKING LOT:

The parking lot on Railroad Avenue has been widened so that cars pull into the lot one direction and park facing the street. This allows cars to pull out onto Railroad Ave. instead of backing out into the traffic.

LITTLE LIBRARIES:

Heritage, Smith, and Peregrine Parks were chosen for the placement of little library kiosks to share books. Public Works Department will be installing them sometime in August.





TRIMMING OF TREES & BUSHES:

All trees must be trimmed up to 12 feet from the ground and down to 3 feet maximum height for bushes along the streets. We would appreciate citizens being mindful of this requirement to keep vegetation trimmed back from streets. Trees must be trimmed by August 15th or the city will be trimming them.

MADISON COUNTY FAIR: The county fair is scheduled for Aug 13th – 16th. EASTERN IDAHO STATE FAIR in Blackfoot, ID:

MADISON COUNTY HAZARDOUS WASTE DAYS: September 6th & 8th from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Madison County Transfer Station, 530 Airport Rd., Rexburg.

STREET PARKING REMINDER: City Code 5-2-6 G prohibits a recreation vehicle from parking on the streets for more than seven (7) consecutive days and no more than fourteen (14) days cumulative total in any one calendar year, and no closer than fifty feet (50') from an intersection. To enhance safety, RV door must face property and not street and slide-outs cannot be opened on the street side.

<u>City Code 6-1-2 A-5</u> prohibits parking trailers, shipping containers, drop boxes and other non-vehicular items on a street for more than 5 days.

<u>PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY City Code 3-1-13-A</u> prohibits accumulation in or about any yard, lot, place or premises, or upon any street, alley or sidewalk adjacent to such lot, yard, place or premises, owned or occupied by such person, any refuse so as to cause or create any offensive odor or atmosphere, be offensive as noticeable, and <u>City Code 3-1-8-A</u> states: ...no person shall deposit or bury any refuse in or upon a public alley, street, other public area or upon the premises of another person, whether or not the refuse is in an approved container. No refuse of any kind shall be thrown, swept or pushed into the street in front of any premises. The owner of the premises shall be responsible for the disposal of all such refuse. **Thank you for keeping our city clean.**
